

Alliteration Always!

Objectives

- Students will write alliteration sentences.
- Students will type their alliteration sentences in *PowerPoint* slides.
- Students will find appropriate illustrations for their alliteration sentences.

Technology Skills Developed

- using presentation software
- inserting clip art into the document
- changing and formatting font type, size and color

Programs Needed

- presentation software such as *PowerPoint*

Step by Step Instructions

1. Review with students the meaning of alliteration—the repetition of the initial consonant sounds in two or more adjacent words. (Example: Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.)
2. Have the students write alliteration sentences individually or in teams.
3. Students will select their favorite alliteration sentences to use in the *PowerPoint* presentation.
4. Have students go to the toolbar and choose **Insert** and then **Text Box**.
5. Students can then type their sentences into the text box.
6. Students can add clip art from the Microsoft Clip Gallery by going to the **Insert** menu and choosing **Clip Art**. If they want to import digital images, whether taken by them or copied from the Internet, they should go to the **Insert** menu, choose **Picture**, and select the folder in which the images have been saved. They can also go to the Drawing toolbar and select *WordArt* or *AutoShapes* to add.
7. Students can format font type, size, and color by choosing **Format** on the toolbar and then selecting **Font**.
8. The *PowerPoint* presentation can then be compiled and shown at Open House or Back to School Night.

Extension Ideas

Alliteration sentences can be made up about famous people, news events, or popular products. The same concept could be used to create an alphabet book on any topic such as animals, countries, or fruits found around the world.

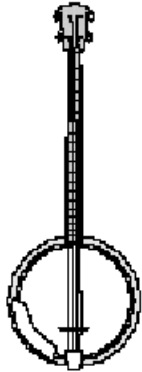

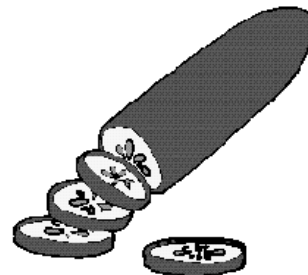
